Invited for Supper

One of the highlights of this past month, for me, was attending the supper prepared for us by the Muslim community. The warmth of the welcome and the depth of the hospitality was lovely.

I particularly appreciated the opportunity to learn more about the Muslim faith and about the practices of Ramadan. As part our time together, we were invited to ask questions and it seems we were most curious about the practice of fasting; no food or drink from sunrise to sunset with only a few exceptions.

Some of us may remember the days when we were encouraged, during Lent, the 40 days before Easter, to enter into the spiritual practice of giving up something. We were encouraged to give up a pleasure in order to focus on the importance of our discipleship and our commitment to Jesus' Way. Some of us still give up a little something; coffee, chocolate, sweets. Giving up coffee or chocolate doesn't seem like much of a sacrifice or discipline when compared to our Muslim friends. They let go of eating and drinking everything for the entire day until sundown, for 29 or 30 days.

I had the privilege of sitting with Dr. Fatima Coovadia on the evening of the Supper and as she was preparing to break the fast, I asked her if she was hungry. Dr. Fatima said that during the Ramadan fast her body adjusted. Although she missed her morning tea, she was only able to eat a little bit of food when she broke fast but often would have more later. I was amazed to think that her spiritual practice actually changed her physiology.

Fatima's response got me thinking about my journey as a follower of Jesus. It's a pretty comfortable association in comparison.

If I understand the Ramadan fast correctly, its purpose is to help the follower become a better person and a better Muslim, more devoted to a life of faith.

Now I'm not suggesting that to be faithful we need to be uncomfortable or to change our very physiology. Perhaps when we are called to serve in a way that is a bit inconvenient or something tugs hard at our heart and makes us uncomfortable, we might pay attention to what God is showing us. Perhaps instead of avoiding the inconvenience and discomfort we might trust that we are being led to a deeper faith and a more vibrant discipleship.

I am grateful for the learnings of that evening of sharing in abundant food and good company. I am grateful to our Muslim siblings for their hospitality and the wisdom they shared with us. I am also grateful to Claudia, our Assistant Office Administrator for working through the details so that this important event could take place.



Did You Know?

Despite the changes at the Lighthouse, support and programming is continuing for the people who reside there.

In the Independent Tower there are approximately 60-70 residents.

In the Supported Tower there are approximately 60 people including those who are being supported in one of the following three programs:

MAP (Managed Alcohol Program) - 8 participants

Complex Needs Program - 16 participants

Compass Program (supports people with alcohol/drug issues) - 5 participants

Those involved in the three programs are long term as are the residential clients, so the number of people supported are quite stable.

The Lighthouse is still accepting donations of:

- Clothing all types of adult clothing including socks, undergarments, pants, tops, sweaters, jackets and hats.
- Bedding sheets (all sizes from twin to queen, pillowcases, quilts, blankets)
- Non- perishable food
