It will be a Harvest theme, so cowboy hats and plaid are welcome! Suspenders too, if you must!!! 😄



The annual general meetings of McClure Place Association Inc. and McClure Place Foundation Inc. will take place as follows:

All members and adherents of McClure United Church are invited to attend this meeting as voting members. Guests are also welcome to attend.

Aside from the usual reports from the Board and related committees, and the Executive Director, there will be the receipt of the audited financial statements and a recommendation of the auditor to be appointed for the upcoming year.

There will be three standard motions brought before the assembly (financial statements for each of MPAI and MPFI, recommendation of auditor) and one other motion that is for an operational decision that the Board feels needs membership approval. All of the meeting details, including the motions, are contained in the annual reports that will be available on or before May 14 at the offices of both McClure Place and McClure Church. The annual reports will also be placed on the McClure Place website (www.mcclureplace.ca).



The McClure Place Foundation Big Shred event, which took place on May 6, 2023, resulted in a total of \$11,202. being raised and just under 500 patrons being served.
