What happened to the Moss Bag?

Last week someone asked me about the beautiful Indigenous Moss bag that we talked about in church awhile back. As you know I found the moss bag in Laura's office after she left. Laura told me that, shortly after the first unmarked graves of Indigenous children had been found on the sight of a residential school, a woman dropped the bag off at the church. I assumed that an Indigenous woman had gifted the bag to the church however I was wrong. The bag had been dropped off by a non-indigenous woman.

So, it was not a gift but rather a surrender of an artifact.

Thank you to Carol Claypool who had the Moss Bag carefully preserved. We have **turned it over the Office of the Treaty Commission** who will return it to the Indigenous community or use it for educational purposes. Debra

On March 13th, a brunch of waffles and sausages was hosted by the kitchen and served to residents who had signed up. Thursday March 14th was Pie Day. McClure Church treated us to tasty lemon & raisin tarts, serve by Reverend Debra & her helpers.

Friday, March 15th, we celebrated St. Patrick's Day. Most residents wore a green hat or green shirt to add to the fun. Cookies with green icing were served with our tea/coffee. Then we moved into the sanctuary for a delightful Irish concert by the McClure Choristers, led by Shirley Blackburn. Between renditions of Irish songs, Joan Brown with her lovely Irish accent, read Irish Blessings and a brief history of Ireland.

On March 20th, our Easter Banquet prepared by the kitchen staff was delicious. Residents collect recyclables and use the funds to subsidize a meal together. Many thanks to Alf & Elsie Bisschop for delivering weekly the items to Sarcan. Following the meal, we were entertained by Saltwater Joy.

Recently, we are able to put in orders for fresh dinner buns which are baked weekly by the kitchen staff, 50 cents/bun, YUM! Thank you to Chris and the kitchen crew for making this happen.

Last week, a residents bake sale was held with proceeds of over \$400. Writers Circle has reconvened Tuesday mornings in the music room. Movie night on the Big Screen happens on alternate Thursdays each month.
