"The rivers do not drink their own water; trees do not eat their own fruit; The sun does not shine on itself, and flowers do not spread their fragrance for themselves. Living for others is a rule of nature. We were all born to help each other. No matter how difficult it is... life is good when you are happy; but much better when others are happy because of you." Pope Frances

This is one of my favorite quotes from Pope Frances.

On Easter Sunday, just one day before his death, Pope Francis made his final public appearance at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Still recovering from bilateral pneumonia, he was too weak to deliver his Easter message himself, so Archbishop Diego Ravelli read it aloud on his behalf.

"I would like all of us to hope anew and to revive our trust in others, including those who are different than ourselves, or who come from distant lands, bringing unfamiliar customs, ways of life and ideas," he said.

The message felt fitting as the Pope's last words — reflective not only of his legacy as a leader who cared deeply about those on the margins of society, but also as a heartfelt plea in a time when the world feels desperately in need of greater compassion and understanding across divides.

It is my prayer that Pope Frances' last words will linger – inspiring acts of kindness, acceptance, and love.

Pope France's last words got me wondering about my own.

What do you want your last words to be?
What do you want of your life to echo into the future?

Important questions to ask ourselves, not easy questions, but important.

At the Board meeting the following were discussed:

The Reverend Jason Richards Community Room Dedication

If you have been following your newsletters this past year, you will know that the former Senior Youth Lounge has been redeveloped. It has been cleaned out, repainted, and new flooring has been installed. It is looking like a space you might rent for a meeting, a gathering for church, a bridal shower, etc. And yes when we have youth in our church, they are welcome to use this room too.


However, the former Senior Youth Lounge has an historic significance to many of us who were here at McClure in the 1990's and beyond. (Reverend) Kent Mohn led youth activities and they met in a very relaxed and welcoming lounge area, complete with soft couches, large pillows, and many games. One of the young people, who grew up in McClure and attended youth activities, was Jason Richards (and his sister Tracy), children of Bruce and Margaret Richards. Jason loved his days of Youth Group and eventually began leading the groups with Kent.

As Jason's life journey unfolded, he enrolled at St. Andrew's College where he began his education as a United Church minister. Jason had the opportunity to study in Seoul, Korea, where he met his wife, Young. The couple married in 2015 and later welcomed their son, Lincoln. Jason received his Masters of Divinity Degree with the United Church of Canada in 2016. He served at St. Paul's United Church in Estevan and St. Mary's United Church in St. Mary's, Ontario.

Sadly, Reverend Jason Richards passed away after a courageous battle with cancer in 2023, at the age of 41. We would like to remember and celebrate Rev. Jason's life and his involvement with McClure. As part of our worship May 18th, we will dedicate the former Senior Youth Lounge and rename it the Reverend Jason Richards Community Room. Following the church service, we will have the opportunity to walk up the stairs, (or take the elevator) to view the newly renovated room and continue to celebrate Jason's legacy. Refreshments will be served as part of the celebration. It will be a special time of remembrance.

If you know some McClure folks who knew Rev. Jason, we are asking you to reach out and invite them to come and share in this dedication. Jason the boy, the young man, the youth leader, the husband, the father, and the Reverend was very special to us at McClure. All are welcome to attend to share in this event.

Toilet Troubles



The washrooms by the office and Multi-Purpose Room (MPR) have been backing up frequently. This is due to a sag in the

drain line under the MPR floor. We have a proposed solution to this and hopefully these will be fully functional again in a couple of months.

At the end of March, a toilet in the men's room near the Nursery backed up. At the same time, the flush valve stuck open, so a lot of water leaked. Thank you to the housekeeping staff who got the water shut off and cleaned up a big mess!

The water damaged materials in the Library and the washrooms have been removed. This includes carpet, and the bottom bit of drywall and insulation. The walls in the washrooms have been temporarily covered and the washrooms are back in service. As the rebuilding/ repairs proceed, these washrooms may be intermittently unavailable.

Note that the Library bookcases and their contents were not damaged. We plan to leave the Library out of service for a

few months, while other planned work in that area is completed. In the meantime, we will work hard to keep washrooms available.

Did you know we have washrooms on the 2nd floor? Go up the stairs by the nursery to find them.

Besides the sag in the drain line that affects the office/MPR washrooms, the main issue is the things people have been flushing.

Please NEVER flush the following:

- Flushable wipes
- Feminine products including tampons
- Paper towel

Please ONLY flush things produced by your body and a reasonable amount of toilet paper. No exceptions, not even one time.

We are very fortunate to have a variety of washrooms in the building. If we only had one set of washrooms, and had to shut them down for repairs, we'd be in deep doodoo.

In the meantime, your Property Committee and the McClure Place maintenance staff are working hard to get our washrooms fully functional again.

Food events this past month:

- 1. A waffle/sausage brunch was enjoyed in early April. Following the brunch, an Easter concert by Michael Swan on violin accompanied by Gillian Lyons on the piano was lovely and well attended.
- 2. A delicious Easter Banquet of ham was prepared by our kitchen staff on April 16th. It was attended by approximately 100 people, who are mostly residents. Entertainment following the meal was by the band "Saltwater Joy" which played a variety of music suitable for listening/dancing.

Our Recreational Director, Jamie is presently on maternity leave, awaiting the birth of her baby daughter. We welcome Erin Smorodin who is taking over Jamie's position for 18 months.

To cut down on steam from regular water that may affect our smoke alarms, Foundation funds were used to purchase a new water distillation unit. Many residents attend & participate in the current events sessions led by Clay on Friday mornings after coffee. This helps us to sort out the world news. Our March charity raised \$300 for the Kidney Foundation of Canada.
