October is a month of Thanksgiving for us here at McClure. October 1st, we give thanks for the gift of God's nourishment by celebrating World Communion Sunday together. Thanksgiving is on my mind and heart these days and so when I sat down at the McClure Church Board meeting this past week, gratitude overflowed.

I think I have seen Heather Muirhead, the co-chair of the Board everyday this week and Michael Gorniak the other half of the co-chair team, every other day. Most recent, Heather and I attended the meeting of the Saskatoon and area Cluster gathering at Mayfair United Church.

Gaylene Gorniak is another person I have seen around the church most every day. Gaylene is the Chair of the Ministry and Personnel committee, and she is working to figure out our office staff configuration and she has jumped in to the job of sorting out the rental situation.

Bryan Hamp is the Property chair and he and the Property committee keep on top of Church repairs and also work with McClure Place as together we coordinate projects. Maureen Sinclair and the worship committee found preachers this summer to cover when I was on holiday and created "guide for hosting" these visiting preachers. Sandy Hoenecke is a "member at large" of the Board (not a large member) and gathers all the committee reports and sends them out to Board members and then takes minutes at the Board meeting which she then sends out to folks a day or two later. Carol Dione just started on the Board and had a big first meeting as she is representing the Outreach committee. Carol shared the Outreach Committee's proposed job description for a new contract position. Elaine Niebergall our Treasurer always has a detailed financial report for the Board and frankly she knows so much more then she should (wow) because she has been covering for our paid financial person who is on a slow return to work path.

Ed Tymchatyn represents the Stewardship committee, that wonderful group of folks who understand numbers and who lift up issues of good stewardship. Brenda Zuk, Chair of our Trustees understands insurance, investments, and the capital budget. The Capital budget is pulled together by a committee of one, Julie Jones, who then vets it through Property, the Board and then Trustees and finally brings it before the congregation at the Annual General Meeting. Naomi Yeun is the Chair of Congregation Care which makes sure the coffee is on, people who cannot get to church are cared for and our commitment to Amy's house is fulfilled. Those who **serve** on the Board are an extraordinary gift.

Then there is Celeste and Tamara who not only offer their musical gifts but who change the banners and decorate on special occasions. Elaine keeps the plants watered and does a dozen little things to keep us organized. Carol does the cradle roll and sends birthday cards to the little ones for three years, and both write sympathy cards to those experiencing loss. Rick changes the sign out front. Ebba puts the coffee on every Sunday. Karl sets the chairs for the choir for practise and for Sunday mornings. Three different women take turns programing the cameras for worship; Tamara, Celeste and Natashia. Two guys share the operation of the cameras: Gary and Gord and two other guys share the sound board operation, Jim and Joel.

I can't even imagine how many hours Diane and Sheila have put into making sure we all had our pictures taken. Then there is all the work done by committee members. And I know just by making this list I have left out dozens more who in big and small ways **serve.**



Administrative Assistant

McClure United Church seeks an experienced and efficient Administrative Assistant for general and specific administrative duties in support of a full range of ministries, activities, office and building management typical of a multi-staff large congregation.

The Administrative Assistant will support ministerial and other staff and volunteer leaders and supervise and coordinate the work of office volunteers. As the front-face of the congregation through front-desk reception, telephone, e-mail and social media communications, the Administrative Assistant will possess strong interpersonal relationship skills, empathy, discretion and confidentiality, and an innate sense of when something is a pastoral relationship matter requiring involvement of ministerial staff.

The successful candidate will have demonstrated in their previous experiences they are internally motivated, able to function without day-to-day supervision, and are able to organize and prioritize multiple demands on their time and attention. They will demonstrate a high level of attention to detail in all communications, including listening, reading, writing and speaking. The applicant must have:

- exceptional computer skills
- be proficient with the Microsoft suite of products
- have experience with Canva or a willingness to learn
- have experience posting information to multiple social media platforms
- are able to navigate and learn new software, including church-specific programs

Experience with standard office software, specifically Microsoft Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Outlook (or webmail), is essential. Familiarity with basic accounting programs such as QuickBooks and/or Simply Accounting would be a benefit. Preference will be given to individuals who are prepared to work 30 hours/week. The position comes with a competitive salary and benefits package. Start date for the position – as soon as possible.

Specific Duties:

- Work hours are 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. with a one-hour lunch break. Front-desk office hours at reception, from Tuesday to Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. (the office is closed from 12-1 p.m. over lunch). Hours for the Administrative Assistant need to cover the office hours, but additional hours required of the position can be flexible, provided the additional duties can be fulfilled.
- Management of a reception desk in a busy office, including in-person interactions, multiple phone lines, email, and social media requirements.
- Administrative and communications support for ministerial staff.
- Close collaboration and liaison with the Administrative Officer who manages the bookkeeping and supports the Treasurer.
- Liaison and collaboration with communications staff and volunteers.
- Coordination and supervision of church office volunteers.

Salary Range:

Starting at \$19.25 per hour for 30 hours/week, plus benefits as per United Church of Canada guidelines.

SOCKS FOR THE HOMELESS

Once again McClure is collecting filled socks for the homeless in Saskatoon If you are looking for an act of kindness, and/or another alternative to gift giving this Christmas, you might want to consider doing up a sock for either a homeless man or a woman in Saskatoon. Make it a family affair.

Please mark the socks for either a woman or man.

Bins will be placed inside of the <u>East doors</u> for the socks. We ask you to fill the socks and bring them to the church either on **Sunday, November 19 or November 26** and any time that the office is open during those particular weeks. This will give us plenty of time to get them to the appropriate people for distribution in time for Christmas.

The items will be handed out to men and women living on the street by Community Support Officers during the weeks before Christmas.

SUGGESTIONS FOR SOCKS FOR THE HOMELESS (MEN AND WOMEN)

- Start with a good pair of warm socks.
- Fill one of the socks with any of the following suggested items plus the sock that you have not used.

Toiletries:

Bar of soap in a container

Travel size – shampoo, hand lotion, Kleenex, band aids, toothpaste, toothbrush, shaving cream.

Brush and comb

Razor – preferably a good razor, not disposable

Hand sanitizer

Survival Items:

Gloves, toque, hand warmers, shoe warmers, silver thermal blanket (\$Store), poncho (\$store)

Miscellaneous:

Nail clippers, deck of cards, flashlight, dice, notepad and pen, wrapped candy, candy canes, hot chocolate packages, cup of soup packages, etc.

Gift Certificates from any place like Tim Horton's, McDonald's that are open 24 hours (place of refuge in -40 degree weather).

• Once the sock is full, add a Christmas Card with a special handwritten message such as:

Prayers are with you,

May you find peace and love in the following year,

You are loved, etc.

If you wish you may also make a donation to the office and specify for the Socks for the Homeless Project, we will use this money to purchase gift cards to put into the socks.
