SPIRITUAL GROWTH AND SUPPORT

McClure also holds special services throughout the year. These would include All Saints Day, Christmas Eve, Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday Services. In the past we have also held a city wide, overnight Easter Vigil for youth!

CHAPEL: McClure has a small chapel available for those who wish to come and spend some time in prayer and meditation. This chapel is available any time our building is unlocked (8am-7pm most weekdays)

MEMORIAL LIBRARY: We are fortunate to have a good library with many books for both adults and children to borrow. There are helpful resources here for bible study, grief, addictions, family relationships, and more.

<u>CONFIRMATION:</u> Faith exploration classes are offered every year from January through April for youth and adults of all ages in perpetration for a commitment of faith. Please contact our office and/or our minister(s) to register!

<u>DISCUSSION GROUPS:</u> We have several adult faith discussion

KIDS ACTIVITIES

NURSERY: For children 3 years old or younger, there is a nursery available where an adult may choose to take the child. It is equipped with toys, a change table, books, and there is a speaker so that the church service can be heard. It is located just to the right as you exit the sanctuary, opposite to the washrooms.



<u>CHILDREN'S' MINISTRY:</u> Rainbow Village is a program run by Eden Polischuk at the 10am service. Kids ages 4 to grade 6 are welcome to join for a story, crafts, and activities after the first full hymn of the worship service! Sometimes there are even snacks, yum!



Regular attendees should fill out a registration form and return it to the office for safety reasons, visitors do not need to sign anything!

Please note that children ages 2 to 3 can attend rainbow village is they bring their grown-up with them!

<u>FAMILY FUN:</u> McClure hosts different events throughout the year focused on families and creating community! Our Outreach committee hosts a family dance every fall and we often hire a summer employee to be a community engagement coordinator! Keep your eye on our calendar to find out when these events are happening!

<u>VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL:</u> This is a week long day camp program for children (Kindergarten to Grade 5) that we have during the summer! Children get to learn ore about the bible, make friends, play games, and eat snacks! Before and after care can be offered for children! Bursaries can be given to accommodate children from low income house holds.

Youth and Young Adult Activities

YOUTH GROUP: McClure is in the process of building our youth group program! This will be for youth grades 7 to 12 and will meet during the weekly worship services.

Kyle Feader is the city wide youth leader and he hosts youth nights every week, see schedule on our website for details!

ADULT GROUPS AND ACTIVITIES

MEN'S BREAKFAST (MONTHLY): The first Sunday of every month is the Men's Breakfast in our Dining Hall! Breakfast is \$10 and is prepared by the McClure Place kitchen! Pre-register to secure your spot!

<u>MEN'S GATHERING GROUP (MONTHLY):</u> Meets one Saturday every month at 8am for fellowship and faith discussions!

<u>WOMEN'S GATHERING GROUP (MONTHLY)</u>: Meets one Saturday every month at 8am for fellowship and faith discussions. Note: we do not have an organizer for a Women's breakfast group at this time, but volunteers are welcome to create one!

QUILTING GUILD (WEEKLY): Every Thursday from 1:30-3:30pm in our Craft Room! This group brings their own sewing machines and creates quilts and sewing projects. Some work on their own projects while others create items to sell for Outreach fundraisers. New Members always welcome, limited storage available for material.

<u>FIT AFTER FIFTY (WEEKLY:</u> Most Mondays and Thursdays from 4-5pm in our Multi-Purpose Room! This is a free exercise class and a good way to stay healthy!



VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

AMY MCCLURE HOUSE BREAKFAST: Assisting in serving breakfast to the residents of Amy McClure House every morning.

SUNDAY MORNING COFFEE HOST: Makes and serves coffee on Sunday mornings for after the worship service. Sign up sheets are in the dining room on Sunday mornings.

HOSPITALITY GROUP: Provide funeral/memorial receptions at the church. Help to set up, serve, and clean up for these events

KNITTING PRAYER SHAWLS: Knit and donate prayer shawls that are given to people who are sick and/or are in need within the community. Patterns for the shawls can be found on our bulletin boards.

REFUGEE ASSISTANCE GROUP: Help sponsor and organize for refugees to safely come to Saskatoon. Ensure refugees have resources once they arrive.

MEALS ON WHEELS: Help deliver meals and/or groceries to people who are unable immobile.

<u>USHERS AND GREETERS:</u> Help to welcome everyone at the door(s) of our church on Sunday morning. Help people find seating and be available to answer questions for new comers. Sign up sheets are available on Sunday mornings and on our bulletin boards.

<u>TECH-BOOTH VOLUNTEERS:</u> Get training to help with the tech on Sunday mornings! This includes progressing the PowerPoint slides, controlling the volume of the microphones, and running the livestream on YouTube!

HOW ELSE CAN I HELP?

- ▶ **WEAR YOUR NAMETAG**: Wearing a nametag helps everyone. They can be ordered at the church office and come in 3 types: pin, magnetic, and pocket.
- ▶ **USED STAMPS**: for the Canadian Bible Society. Please trim the stamps. There is a box on top of the literature rack in the main lobby to put them in.
- ▶ **USED EYEGLASSES**: are collected and restored for use in vision programs in other countries.
- ▶ **USED MAGAZINES**: are collected on the first Sunday of each month (Oct-June) for literacy programs here in Saskatoon.
- ▶ **FOOD BANK**: there is a barrel by the library for donations of food for the Saskatoon Food Bank.
- ▶ FRIENDSHIP INN: there is a container by the library for donations of pasta for Friendship Inn.
