My walk with faith - Mya Linsley Kreutzwieser

Hello my name is Mya Linsley Kreutzwieser. I'm 15 years old and I have been coming to church since I was born. I was baptized by Ron McConnell when I was six months old.

We would come every Sunday with my grandma Evelyn and my grandpa Bill. About nine years ago my grandma passed away suddenly and devastated our whole family and then about four and a half years ago my grandpa passed away.

I questioned everything; I didn't even know if I believed in God anymore. I didn't know how he could take away both of my grandparents in such a short time. It almost felt like I was being punished. Without my grandparents with us church slowly fell out of our routine. It was sometimes just too hard to be there without them or we got busy with our other activities and God fell to the back of my mind. I felt alone and that's how I thought I was supposed to feel. I blamed that feeling on grief. I carried the burden of my grief by myself.

Flash forward to the beginning of this past summer and we found out grandpa (on the other side of the family) had cancer. I felt lost and scared and that everything in this world was out of my control. I didn't know how to keep going with all my worries and fears when I already knew how it felt to lose someone I loved so much.

The next day when I was confiding in one of my closest friends she asked if it would be ok if she prayed for my grandpa. I didn't know what to think, it was such a simple and kind act, so I said yes. I had not thought about God in so long but this thought brought so much comfort to me.

That night before I went to sleep, I decided to kneel down beside my bed and I prayed. I prayed for my loved ones who had passed, I prayed for my family, I prayed for my grandpa and I prayed for strength. This quickly became a habit. Every night I would pray for my family and friends and strength to carry on. It felt like all the burdens that I was carrying; God was helping me carry. I started to understand that God does not punish you, sometimes the bad things in your life are for you to grow from and they are just one stone in the path God has put you on. I am now trying to walk this path not alone but knowing that Jesus was there with me. In August this summer my other grandpa passed away. It broke me like it did years ago, but this time I came back to the surface instead of sinking down because God was there helping me carry the grief. I felt this shift in my life thanks to God so I felt like I wanted to get back to going to church. The only way to describe the feeling of warmth of going to church is like a hug from your grandma. No matter what age you are, it is still loving and welcoming. Sometimes it's hard to go to church every Sunday and sometimes it's hard to walk on the path God puts you on but God has a plan that I have to trust.

It was so good to welcome Ron and Michele to McClure on October 30th. We had a wonderful celebration making Rev. Ron McConnell **Minister Emeritus** of McClure United Church, which is a gift given to a minister of exceptional service.

Minister Emeritus is a title letting the receiver know that their past service has been blessing and to assure the receiver that they are invited to attend worship and special occasions of the church.

The **Voluntary Associate Minister (VAM)** acknowledgement is a requirement of the Living Sky Region of the United Church. A Voluntary Associate Minister is a United Church of Canada ordained, diaconal, or designated lay minister in who is retired or between calls or appointments, is in good standing within the regional council, and has a formal association with a community of faith, in this case, with McClure United Church.

The Voluntary Associate Minister designation is required for retired ministry personnel to continue to, **when invited**, to continue to participate in the functions of ministry. This designation opens the retired minister up for invitations to lead worship, preside at communion, read scripture, and other functions of ministry within McClure United Church and the whole Region. Just to clarify, Ron is not on staff here at McClure but we are able to invite him to participate fully in the life and ministry of McClure and so too are other communities of faith.



A cantata is a musical composition for singers combined with narration (a re-telling of the scriptures) and orchestra bringing the light of the world through Jesus to us.


To quote the composer "Christmas reminds us that the star which once shone over Bethlehem still shines in the hearts of those who seek the warmth of God's embrace."




Volunteers are needed for the ministry of serving Funeral Lunch

There are 3 "categories" of volunteers for each funeral: set-up, servers & dishwashers.

The food is bought by our convener. The lunches have been kept simple (due to covid) ie: fruit & dainties. Our convener & two volunteers will

SET-UP the food a few hours in advance of the funeral. They also prepare the coffee urn and have it ready to plug in, kettles of water ready to be plugged in to boil for tea. Juice available. Tables have been set up by Staff. Tablecloths & dishes are placed. Then their job is done.

The second group are **SERVERS**. When phoned, the volunteer SERVERS would be given a time to come into the serving area during the funeral service. They would serve the beverages & food, refilling as necessary. The number of expected funeral guests is known before we start phoning for volunteers, because the bereaved family has given approximate numbers. Therefore we phone volunteers accordingly.

The 2 DISHWASHERS would come to the serving area, and start to pick up the used dishes when guests leave, taking them to the kitchen to be put through the dishwashing machines.

The time needed for SET-UP would be an hour & a half to two hours, depending on the number of guests expected. The time needed for **SERVING** would be approximately two hours or more, this also depends on the number of guests; a larger crowd takes more time, and some families visit longer than others.

FOOD BANK CHALLENGE

I would like to challenge the congregation to bring one food item each Sunday of December to the barrel in the front lobby for each adult in the family. I was disappointed as I put an item in this Sunday to find the two cans of soup that I had put in the empty barrel last Sunday and that they had been joined by just two boxes of cookies. Surely a congregation of our size can fill that barrel every week if we just tried by bringing one item per adult. When we shop, we see several food items on sale: three cans of vegetables for \$5; a box of tea bags for \$4; a jar of jam \$3; a bag of sugar \$2.99, a box of juice \$1.35, etc. I would like to think that most of us could spare \$2-\$5 each week for the four Sundays of December to help lessen the hunger in our city. (Yes, we might have to forego a coffee and muffin once during the week, but I think that is so little to "sacrifice" for others in need this winter.)


