You're probably feeling it, too—that sense that the ground is shifting beneath our feet. If the systems, our neighbours to the South relied on are crumbling, one wonders about our good old Canadian systems. When threats are thrown our way almost daily that target our economy, sovereignty and our character we can't help but feel somewhat unsteady.

When things feel this shaky, it's easy to spiral into fear.
To wonder, *how will we hold it all together?*

But here's the thing: **we've always held each other together.**

When the world gets to be a fragile place, it's the people around us—our neighbours, our friends, our communities—who keep us together. It's in those small, everyday acts of care and solidarity that we're reminded who we really are.

I've been thinking about something Desmond Tutu once said: *"My humanity is bound up in yours, for we can only be human together."* That feels especially true right now.

The practice of neighbours supporting neighbours— isn't just about getting by; it's about reclaiming that sacred connection we have with one another. It's about recognizing that when one of us is struggling, it impacts all of us. And when we show up for each other, we all become stronger.

This isn't a new idea. The early church communities knew this deeply. In the book of Acts, we read that *"all the believers were together and had everything in common... they gave to anyone who had need."* (Acts 2:44-45) They didn't wait for permission to help each other. They just did it because love—real, messy, practical love—calls us to action.

As things become challenging, **now's the time to lean in.** It doesn't have to be perfect. It doesn't have to be formal. Just look around and see who needs a hand—and who's ready to lend one. Maybe it's organizing a grocery run for a neighbor. Maybe it's just showing up, listening, and reminding people that they're not alone in this.

We've been through hard times before. We know how to find our way through. **Let's love our neighbours.** Let's share what we have. And let's build the kind of community that reflects the very best of who we are. When we do that, we're not just surviving this moment—we're planting seeds for something better, something more just, more compassionate, and more beautiful.

LENTEN PRACTISE

The **Seasons of The Church** help us to retell the story of Jesus life; Advent - the preparation of Jesus birth, Christmas – the birth of Jesus, Epiphany -the story of Jesus' mission, baptism and miracles. Then comes the season of Lent, a time to focus our hearts on repentance and prayer. Easter retells the story of Jesus' suffering and resurrection.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of the Season of Lent which lasts for 40 days remembering the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness. It is marked with a time of worship that reminds us of our need for forgiveness and repentance. The United Church Song of Faith puts it like this: "God reconciles, and calls us to repent the part we have played in damaging our world, ourselves, and each other. God transforms, and calls us to protect the vulnerable, to pray for deliverance from evil, to work with God for the healing of the world, that all might have abundant life".

NEWS FROM THE MCCLURE CHURCH BOARD

Board Report

Our worship space has a different look these days as excitement mounts for the Seussical the Musical production by the McClure Players that will be staged March 6-9. The themes are friendship, loyalty, the power of the imagination, and the importance of believing in the unseen. Seussical premiered in the Richard Rodgers Theatre in 2000. In that same year, **McClure United Church and Holy Spirit Roman Catholic Church** signed a Covenant and we will be celebrating 25 years together on March 16.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5 and ends on Maundy Thursday, April 17. There are many opportunities during Lent to worship, reflect, and be part of the community of McClure United Church. Psalm 42:2 – “My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?”

February 23 was the date of our Congregational Meeting to discuss the finances of McClure and accept the prepared Capital Budget. The Capital Planning Report was received for information. A great number of volunteer hours are spent in preparation of these documents and the Board is grateful for the generosity of those involved.

We are looking forward to the **Annual General Meeting, set for May 25**, and the decisions that will direct our congregation in the coming year.

To quote the Seussical character, Jojo: “You have brains in your head. You have feet in your shoes. You can steer yourself in any direction you choose.”

The Committees and Board are currently reviewing and updating their Terms of Reference.

Many of our Church Committees are in need of members. Leadership roles in Committees, as well as a Co-Chair will be needed. Please consider how you may use your talents to be more involved in a leadership role in our congregation.

UPSTAIRS REFRESH

Have you ever taken the stairs up to McClure's second floor?

Or maybe you've taken the elevator (please tell me you remembered your cell phone) to lift something heavy or cumbersome. Well if you've been up there, you will experience a wonderful Preschool, full of life and vitality.

As you make your way down the hall you will see the audio-visual room where all the magic for Sunday worship and other events occurs.

Then there is a space that is very busy now, and that is called the McClure Players room. Sets, costumes, props, actors are all making their home there for a few more weeks.

But if you keep on going, you will encounter a large, (may I say unhappy looking) room that has sat idle for a long while. **It is called the Senior Youth Lounge.** Until recently, this was a room full of memories for some. Others might see a room full of old dusty furniture, cupboards of dated dusty dishes, an air hockey table that no longer works, some interesting books, chalk drawings and ceiling tiles decorated as art projects about 15 years ago. Bittersweet, it reminded us of our teens who are in their 30's now, who used this room as a sanctuary for their senior youth group.

However, a change is in the wind. The budget we discussed and approved at the Congregational meeting on Feb. 23, included \$10,000 to refurbish, reinvent, repurpose, and rename this spacious rental area of the future. It will be a space that folks will be proud to use and will also provide some rental income for McClure. We are also hopeful that there will be youth using this space one day too.

We want to thank Charlotte Campbell, and husband Cal for "volunteering" to manage this project. Charlotte very patiently has been finding new homes for the furniture, rerouting games to Camp Tapawingo, making sure ministerial staff might provide a use for anything in storage. Charlotte and her two grand-daughters even spent a weekend cleaning out the dishes and cupboards that haven't been looked at for a very long time. A huge THANK YOU TO CHARLOTTE for this gift of her time. She continues to work figuring out what our next steps will be with this project.

And so the journey continues. The room will be painted soon. The artistic tiles have been taken out of the ceiling and await a creative idea on how best to display this archive of a day gone by. There have been some wonderful new names suggested for the space. The windows have been washed and the blinds lifted and already the room is cheerier and brighter than it has been in a long while. It is indeed a project to celebrate the future.

So after the dinner theatre set designs are completed and on stage, and you are exploring a bit, take the stairs up, or the elevator (if you dare!!) and come and see the progress. This room, has a lot of history, but now it has a future.

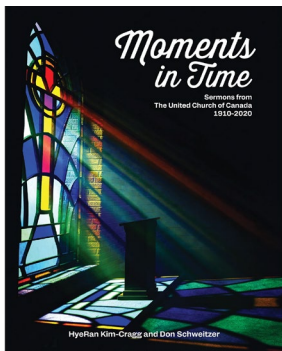

Superbowl football was watched on the Big Screen. A few residents won some cash with pool ticket guesses, the remainder of the proceeds was donated to our Van Fund.

Prior to Valentines Day, carnations were offered for sale and delivery through Jamie, our recreational director. We could send anyone in the building a carnation, with or without our signature. It was fun to go to our rooms following the Rib Buffet supper, and find a carnation or two in our “home mailbox.” We also celebrated at coffee time with fancy cookies.

The kitchen held a Bake Sale during coffee time one day with a big variety of goodies; the money raised will go towards the purchase of a new freezer. Homemade nutritious soups are available from the kitchen to warm us up on these very cold weather days.

The Coronary Artery Rehabilitation Group (CARG) of Saskatoon has a program which provides individuals with a heart pillow following their cardiac surgery. McClure Place has for a number of years been the first step in the pillow’s journey—by tracing and cutting out the fabric heart shapes. This takes place Monday mornings in the Hospitality Lounge. 
