#### Caring for the Spirit of the Children

My kids grew up going to church but it wasn't exactly an every Sunday kind of thing. When they were very little my husband and I had to find childcare Sunday mornings because we both needed to be on the road.

When we moved into Saskatoon the boys traveled with me to St. Martin's United Church. During the first service they played video games in my office and during the second service they attended Bible Adventures or Sunday school. The boys also took part in VBS and Family Camp. They could sing the "Lord's My Shepherd" to the tune of the "Happy Wanderer" with the best of them.

The boys also participated in a variety of community sports. Isaac was into Baseball and Matthew, Soccer. It was a challenge to maintain our Sunday morning Church attendance given the commitment teams required. We had to tell coaches that we would not be attending practices on Sunday mornings and we might not be available for weekend tournaments. Some coaches looked at us a bit funny but respected our family's choices. We missed some practices, but we managed all tournaments. Even as a single mom, with the help of my parents, the boys managed to have loads of fun and maintain an active lifestyle.

When my work life changed, and I was blessed to join you in ministry here at McClure, things shifted for the boys again. Matthew attended Rainbow Village and Isaac the youth group. When pumping gas at Co-op began to take over Isaac's time, Matthew lost his ride. The boys rarely attend worship now, except for Christmas Eve.

I tell you these things because I know how hard it is to make church attendance a priority, but I want to encourage you to try because this is what I have seen in my own family.

When the boy's grandmother died suddenly in 2015, Isaac came here to McClure the very next Sunday. He knew that when storms hit, he needed community, a safe place to ask questions and to grieve. Last week, a "skip the dishes" driver ask my son, Matthew, if he had a few extra dollars because he was really struggling. Matthew didn't say a thing, he just went to his room and found a few dollars to give the man.

When life served up grief, Isaac didn't go to his baseball coach or to his physics teacher. When someone came to Matthew in need, I don't think he tapped into something his soccer coach said or his French teacher taught.

I'm not telling you these things because I'm some fabulous parent, because I am definitely not. But I want to encourage you to think about the spiritual part of your kids lives. I want you to think about giving your kids a community that can hold them in the storms of life. And about connecting them to people who share your values of generosity, compassion, and kindness.

If you can get here, in person, fabulous! If you can connect on line, that is good too. If Sunday morning doesn't work, please let me know how I can support you as you care for your children's spirit, at home. Whatever is possible, please know you and your family are loved and are held in your church's heart. Together we are God's people.

The **top** of the wall hanging has the sun in it, representing sunrise or sunset.

The **middle** section has the tree of life. The tree of life has been represented by the world's religious, philosophical, and mythological traditions.

There are several references to the tree of life in the Bible the last one being in Revelations 22:14; Blessed are those who wash their robes so that they will have the right to the tree of life and may enter in by the gates.

The **branches** are decorated to represent the four seasons, starting with snow on the left.

The **bottom** of the wall hanging represents the layers of the earth.

## AND THE SURVEY SAYS....

Looking back to the spring, the McClure Church Board invited your responses and feedback about the Rural Connect experience. If you were a person who attended church in person or on-line, your opinion was requested. Responses from Carlyle and Radville, our Rural Connect partners, were also elicited. We appreciated everyone who responded to the survey! The Worship Committee and the Board then set out to review the results of the survey. Here is a short summary of some of the information we found.

Of those who participated in the survey, approximately 80% were positive about our Rural Connect partnership. Many responded (including our partners), that this partnership was a life-line, and that our leadership made us all feel like a larger community of faith.

There were some folks expressing their ideas of possible drawbacks of our partnership. Mentioned repeatedly was less McClure involvement in the worship experience. We will work on making some changes to help with these concerns. Some changes you might notice (most going back to pre-Covid days) will be McClure folks making announcements, and lighting the peace candle. We may begin a rotation with our Rural Connect partners with the saying of prayers and reading scripture. And hopefully children's time will make a return to our services.

Of course, with more jobs for McClure folks in the worship service, the need for volunteers will be increased. We look forward to sign up sheets being filled with enthusiastic helpers to perform these duties. An exciting year of Rural Connect and worship lies ahead.

Keep in mind the words to our Sung Offertory: "What can I do? What can I bring? ..... I'll bring my love. I'll do my share."

# **MCCLURE BOARD NEWS**

### **Projector Replacement**

On July 27, 2023, the Board called a special meeting to discuss replacement of the projectors given they were starting to fail. Prior to this meeting, the Worship Committee passed a motion to spend up to \$25,000 from the Memorial and Bequest ("M&B") Fund for projector replacement but the Stewardship Committee recommended further discussion of this matter given our looming capital fund deficiency.

Julie Jones attended the meeting to provide additional information to the Board with regards to the status of 2023 capital projects. It was brought to the attention of the Board that the resurfacing of the asphalt came in \$10,000 under budget, a budgeted amount of \$10,000 for window and door replacement was not required this year, and there was still \$5,000 in the capital budget for contingencies. It was also brought to the attention of the Board that the roof repairs for the drainage issue on the east and south areas of the building received a quote of \$68,000, with only \$25,000 included in the 2023 capital budget.

The roof assessment itself came in over budget and further work is being done to determine the specifics of the recommended repairs. It is unlikely this project will be started in 2023, but once it is started in a future year, there is the ability to undertake the project in modules rather than doing it all at once.

If projectors were purchased and installed in August, Adam Brookman could assist with the installation and therefore achieve some cost savings.

Given the above information, combined with the fact there was over \$40,000 in the M&B Fund and \$5,000 was already included in the capital budget for projector replacement in 2023, the Board passed a motion to use up to \$20,000 of M&B funds for the replacement of projectors for the enhancement of worship.

#### News from a "Newbie"

Way back in May, the first **Living Skies Regional Council** of the United Church of Canada (since Covid) took place in Prince Albert. Now I've been attending McClure church for about 36 years, but I don't know a thing about the national church, so I "volunteered" to go. As a "newbie" to this gathering, I imagined it would be a dry-kind of churchy informational meeting. But I was very pleasantly surprised.

I met people from all across the province with different concerns in their community of faith. Just to name a few of these concerns, I talked with a fellow with only five people at his church gatherings, a woman who was afraid to talk about affirming issues within her church, and a representative from the United Network for Justice and Peace in Palestine Israel. (I had never heard of that!)

My eyes were opened to all the committees and groups that are hard at work for the United Church of Canada. Groups like the Rural Ministry Network, The Refugee Advisory Group, Western Intercultural Network, Affirming Task Group, Youth and Young Adult Ministries, and the Regina Native Outreach Ministry. As well as listening to the words of some of these important groups, we were asked to prepare to make a couple of important decisions. Firstly, we learned that the structure of the church changed in 2019. Formerly titled, Saskatchewan Conference, the gathering's new name was changed to Living Skies Regional Council.

We needed to decide together to make Living Skies an affirming ministry. This was passed unanimously.

The second church decision (new word for me... **remit**) is more complicated and will take some conversations together with our home church communities. It involves the **establishment of an autonomous National Indigenous organization** within the United Church of Canada.

We were invited to attend a wonderful Pow Wow in Prince Albert, where we witnessed the joy and pride of the Indigenous dancers and speakers.

Later we had a very moving presentation by former chief of the **Cowesses First Nation, Cadmus Delorme.**  Cadmus spoke of his upbringing, his involvement in politics, becoming chief and dealing with the discovery of unmarked graves from the Marieval Indian Residential School.

His words were so very uplifting, yet challenging for us, as we think about our history and our future.

McClure Church Board has the year ahead to listen and study this remit, make a decision and vote for this national church change. There will be an information session for us to attend later in the church year.

Besides all this serious and meaningful discussion, the Living Skies Regional Council was a lot of **fun too**- plenty of singing, new ideas for participation in services, and creative thoughts to promote church.

There was even a light-hearted sermon comparing a good fit with God, to wearing the right kind of underwear!!

Maybe being a "newbie" wasn't so bad!! Heather Muirbead co chair.

All our events were free this summer to participate in, but folks were able to donate to a local charity as they were able in lieu of an admission fee.

I contacted Heather Muirhead, head of our Outreach Committee and co-chair of the board, early in the summer for advice on what local charity McClure was wanting to support. It felt like a fitting touch, when Heather suggested that I collect money for the Baby Steps Program run through Egadz; a program dedicated to providing mothers in need with housing, parental classes, and supports.

As of Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023 we have raised \$637.37 for Baby Steps from our Movie Night, our Mini Golf + Muffin day, our Ecology Presentation, and the Sundae Sunday! Our Last event takes place on the Tuesday, August 29, 2023, so more will be added to this total.

Between this money and our Prairie Harm Reduction Collection Day, I am overwhelmed with how generous our community is. Your compassion does not go unnoticed and it is beyond appreciated.

#### REPORT FROM THE CHAIR OF MCCLURE PLACE ASSOCIATION INC. AUGUST 13, 2023



This newsletter item simply conveys a brief update on what is taking place with the Board of McClure Place Association Inc. (MPAI).

The Board of MPAI comprises a maximum of 12 members and a minimum of seven members as per the MPAI bylaws. A simple majority of the members is required to be members or adherents of McClure United Church. This year, the 10 members from last year's Board were all able and willing to continue on the Board, and we added one new member at the June 4 AGM, Mark Eggleston. Our current Board complement includes: Kristi Baxter, Jim Bugg, Bryan Bilokreli, Lori Chartier, Mark Eggleston, Jim Gillis, Jim Kells, Cara Martens, Shannon Menon, Greg Morrison and Doug Thomson. With one vacancy to achieve the full complement of 12 members, the Board welcomes anyone interested in serving on the Board to contact Jim Kells as Chair of the Nominations Committee (and Board Chair) at their earliest convenience (Jim.Kells@usask.ca). The Board would appreciate having all Board positions filled!!

As Chair, my sense is that the past two years have been rather busy insofar as we had three major projects ongoing, all of which are either completed or in the twilight stages. The heating system for the building (the so-called boiler project, which serves all of the Tower, Amy McClure House and the Church) has been upgraded with new boilers and a fully-flushed heat delivery system, the fire alarm upgrade throughout the Tower has been completed, and the development of an operational plan for the period following the expiration of the 35-yr agreement with the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation has been concluded. Unfortunately, we do have an ongoing legal issue to resolve as a result of the boiler project, and we are yet in the early stages of implementing the post-SHC operational plan.

Two very successful events held late in the last Board year were the Big Shred (May 6) and the Pig Roast (June 23). The Big Shred was organized by Les Ferguson, with delivery assisted by a team of volunteers as well as the Shred It company, who generously donated both equipment and staff. The event raised over \$11,000 in support of Amy McClure House. Thanks to all of the patrons that brought their materials for shredding. The Pig Roast was organized by Lisa White, Executive Director of McClure Place Association and several of her staff members. About 130 people attended the roast and enjoyed an absolutely wonderful Saskatchewan evening, which was complemented by an hour of a musical trio. I might add that as many of the Board members who could attend did enjoy a very nice evening of dinner at Mano's Restaurant just before Christmas (December 14). The conversation was lively throughout!

Some of the focus for the upcoming year, now just beginning, is continued work on the reactivation of the McClure Place Foundation, the development of several policy documents to assist in guiding our operations, a review of the 5-yr capital reserve plan, an assessment of the new provincial legislation regarding Life Interest Lease properties and, hopefully, a strategic planning exercise related to our ongoing and future operations. Already underway is a plan to take over the operation and maintenance of the McClure van, with the Church continuing to have Sunday access, and to take responsibility for room bookings and related arrangements in the Church. Invariably, more work items will arise as the year progresses.

As always, the Board appreciates the leadership provided by MPAI's Executive Director, Lisa White, and all of the other staff members who make McClure Tower and Amy McClure House a great place to live.
